Mrs Honour's last day will be Thursday 28th March.

We are delighted to welcome Mrs Suzanne Rowlands to our teaching assistant team. Mrs Rowlands is an experienced higher-level teaching assistant (HLTA) who brings many skills to our already talented TA team including work on a qualification about dyslexia and running lego therapy. Her passion is English and we are pleased she has offered to run creative writing club for older children which will focus on drama, writing games and inventing stories. She is also leading story club for younger pupils and will share stories, invent stories and use drawing, modelling and play to explore stories.

She will start on 15th April and will work mainly across KS2.





We are also delighted to welcome Mrs Steph Kowalski officially onto our staff team as our after-school care provider for Calm Club. As many of you will already know, Mrs Kowalski has worked for many years in school, though employed by the School Lunch Company serving lunches. Funding Goals -


We have several goals for funding at the moment

- Take minutes at meetings and distribute them.
- Create posters and newsletters.
- Attend trustee meetings, planning and attending future events as part of the team.
