Year 6 Sports Leaders

Many thanks to Sue Cork and Rachel Mills (West Oxfordshire School Games Organiser) who spent a day with our Year 6 children teaching them the skills to become Sports Leaders at St Peter's.

First we had to line up and imagine we were on a tightrope; without 'falling' we had to get in order of our birthdays and door numbers. This was a great team building exercise. The second game was rats and rabbits. The idea of the game was that Mrs Cork or Mrs Mills-our instructors-would tell us to get into partners. They told us to get into two opposing lines next to our partners then they told us if we were rats or rabbits. They then explained that one of them would call out either rats or rabbits; if rats were called they would have to run away from their partner into the safe zone (behind the red cones).

Next they showed us simple tricks to group up children into two groups, eg Get into partners, number yourself one and two, ones in a group and twos in another. Then how not to, eg pick 2 people and then get them to pick people one at a time.

The next activity was making up our own warm ups (Simon says, bean game stuck in the mud, etc.). We had to show the other children.

Finally we had to create our own games: obstacle course, beanbag game, ball figure of eight and clap and catch ball game. Other people tried our games and gave their honest review.

We all thought that this experience was very useful and enjoyable. We also all agree that this will help us a lot during future playleading sessions. We now all know how to be responsible playleaders and will lead safely.
